



You can book the game drives with Kambaku, self-drive or just stay at the lodge - the choice is yours. Excursions to the Panorama route are also on offer, as well as trips to Eswatini (Swaziland) and Mozambique. For the avid golfer, Kambaku will book a game of golf at the famous Leopard Creek Golf Course for a day's fun. Airport transfers are also offered.


Leanne is involved in the KNP Leopards of Malelane group on Facebook where they are busy building a data base of the leopards, their habits and territories in the Malelane area.

So far, this group has named 39 leopards that are seen in the area Kambaku traverses and a further five that have been seen, but not named yet.

A very special addition to Kambaku's offerings is hosting specialised wildlife photographic safari workshops in partnership with Panthera Photo Safaris and award-winning photographer Lance van de Vyver.







These workshops are designed to get photographers into the best areas to get great photographs and where you take your wildlife photography from 'good' to 'great'. It is a fabulous opportunity to learn the tips, techniques and methods of taking great wildlife images from a professional photographer - so not to be missed as you will gain great insight and knowledge while improving your wildlife photography. Kambaku's open safari vehicle is used for this activity, which includes entering the Kruger National Park, an area renowned for the Big 5 as well as cheetah, wild dog and amazing bird life. A private hide is being built especially for the photographic workshops.

Kambaku is a birder's paradise with more than 121 species having been identified at the lodge alone and 220 in the surrounding area. This is a must-visit for avid bird and wildlife photographers thanks to the constant flow of wildlife spotted from your private patio, pool or deck at the fence.



All bookings are customised to your needs, so you can either book self-catering, or enjoy ordered breakfasts, lunches and dinners or combine both options. You can go for a game drive or stay in. You may even decide to self-cater for the duration of your stay - but you really do have to try at least one dinner and one breakfast, or you will miss out on the fabulous hearty meals Kambaku serves on your private patio. They have also just acquired a fabulous new chef to add to the warm and friendly staff, some who have been with the family for many years.









There is a choice of five luxury suites and a honeymoon suite. They all offer river, mountain and Kruger views set in a well-maintained indigenous garden.

The Joao Luxury River Suite offers spacious, luxurious accommodation for two guests and is also equipped to self-cater if needed. Attention to detail is found in all the suites and all have a fabulous view of the river, mountains and Kruger.



All these suites have a private covered patio where you can dine and enjoy gorgeous views of the Crocodile River.

Shingwedzi Family Suite



The shower is shared by the second bedroom but there is also a separate toilet and basin for the second bedroom. The suite has a self-catering kitchen for meals. The suite also offers an African outdoor shower that opens out onto the garden, access to a sparkling pool and to the river deck that overlooks the Crocodile River.

The accommodation has a covered patio, private garden, partial view of the river, mountains and the Kruger, which is the perfect place to enjoy a meal.
